Those clubs offered free because School Staff were running impacted on charging Parents for Clubs with outside providers even when subsidized, as they did not pay or uptake poor. Look into funding all clubs next year even with outside providers . Keep analysis of Clubs and children's sporting activity and repeat next year to compare. Health Day allowed children to participate in activities they do not have the opportunity to access on a day to day basis and created a buzz about PE. Possibly try to give the pupils a choice of activity rather than allocating to Year Groups. Some children commented they missed opportunity to go Horse Riding as an option this year, look into again for next year.
